SECTION 1 - SMALL GRAINS

CLASS:

1. Corn - 3 stalks or 10 ears of corn or popcorn or 1 peck shelled from previous year.
2. Wheat - 1 peck
3. Oats - 1 peck
4. Beans - 3 stalks or 1 peck
5. Any other grain not listed, please identify.

SECTION 2 - FIELD CROPS, OTHER THAN GRAINS

CLASS

1. Potatoes - 32 tubers
2. Hay - Bundle - Forage crops four inches in diameter below heads.
3. Any other field crop not listed - grain sheaves to be three inches.

SECTION 3 - CROP SCIENCE

Learning Objective: For youth to have general knowledge of crop science and crop varieties.

CLASS:

1. Educational exhibit of mounted specimens such as weeds, crop varieties, etc.
2. Educational Exhibit - A display or exhibit of some phase of field crop science. Notebooks or workbooks if exhibited must be part of a total exhibit, including other item or items.

SECTION 4 - HERBS

CLASS:

1. Diary of herbs grown, diagram of garden.
2. Exhibit of dried herbs (minimum 10) with identification sheets.

3. Arrangement made of dried herbs, (varieties included should be listed on an attached 3 x 5 card).
4. Different uses of herbs. An educational display on the different uses of herbs.
5. Seasoning mixture, list or display of varieties included.
6. Garden bouquet of five (5) or more fresh herbs including foliage. Must be able to identify herbs used.
